Note to Candidates:

The purpose of this test is to familiarize Advanced Referee candidates with the kinds of questions they will encounter on the Advanced Referee Exam. It is not a substitute for the Advanced Referee Exam and does not count toward upgrade. Doing well on this sample exam does not guarantee that you will do well on the Advanced Referee Exam.

Answer all questions according current editions of authoritative documents published by FIFA, USSF, and AYSO. ***Do not assume any other modifications to the Laws unless explicitly directed.*** For example, questions about field dimensions should be answered per Law 1, not using the dimensions employed in small-sided games.

Do not add or assume extra conditions that aren't stated in the question. For example, unless otherwise directed, do not assume that the ball is in the penalty area. However, questions may describe situations in which the referee should apply the advantage clause or recognize a trifling infringement.

The Advanced Referee Exam has approximately 80 questions.

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True/False Questions

In the following questions, circle T for "true" or F for "false".

- 1) T F The referee has blown her whistle to signal for the end of the half. As the players are leaving the field a Blue player uses abusive language toward a Red player. The referee sends off the Blue player. As a result the Blue team must play short for the remainder of the game.

- 2) T F All free kicks must be played in a forward direction.

- 3) T F The referee blows her whistle for the opening kick-off, but instead of kicking the ball, the Red attacker runs across the center circle and violently strikes a Blue opponent who does not retaliate. The referee quickly intervenes and sends off the Red attacker. As a result the Red team must play shorthanded for the entire game.

- 4) T F When a penalty kick has been awarded, the defending team may replace its goalkeeper with one of the other players on the field.

- 5) T F At the taking of a throw-in deep in its own end of the field, the defending team may throw the ball in to its goalkeeper.

Circle the most correct answer for the following questions.

- 6) A player who is lying on the ground kicks the ball. No other player is nearby. What is the restart?
- A. Direct free kick

- 7) If time is extended for a penalty kick, that extension lasts until
- A. the goalkeeper controls the ball
 - B. a goal is scored
 - C. the ball rebounds into the field of play without going into the goal

 - E. any of the above
- 8) A player tackles an opponent (that is, challenges for the ball with the legs) from behind and dispossesses her of the ball. No contact is made with the opponent. What is the restart?
- A. Direct free kick
 - B. Indirect free kick
 - C. Penalty kick
 - D. None -- there is no infringement.
- 9) At the taking of a penalty kick during regulation time, the ball rebounds from a goalpost to the kicker, who shoots the ball into the goal. The referee should:
- A. Award a goal.
 - B. Order the penalty kick retaken.
 - C. Award the opposing side an indirect free kick.
 - D. Award the opposing side a goal kick.

- 10) An attacker's progress is impeded by a defender inside the goal area. The indirect free kick is taken:

Restart Scenarios

In each of the following situations, you are to determine what restart, if any, is appropriate. Assume the two teams are Red and Blue unless otherwise stated. For each situation:

- If play has not stopped, decide if it should continue. If so, write **None** for the restart.
- Otherwise (that is, if play has stopped or if the referee should stop play), decide what the restart should be and which team will take it. Use the following abbreviations:

KO - kick-off

GK - goal kick

DFK - direct free kick

DB - dropped ball

CK - corner kick

PK - penalty kick

TI - throw-in

IFK - indirect free kick

For a dropped ball restart, it is not necessary to indicate a team color.

Unless otherwise stated, assume that the ball is in play and is outside the penalty area.

Each question in this section is worth one point.

No credit will be given for a correct restart with an incorrect team color.

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- 14) A Blue defender trips a Red attacker about one yard outside the penalty area. The attacking player falls into the penalty area.

The restart is a _____ for the _____ team.

- 15) The Blue goalkeeper punches the ball out of play when he is two yards outside his penalty area.

The restart is a _____ for the _____ team.

- 16) The Red goalkeeper standing within his own goal area receives the ball directly from a throw-in by his teammate and plays the ball with his hands.

The restart is a _____ for the _____ team.

Misconduct Scenarios

Directions: For the following question(s), indicate:

- 1) MISCONDUCT: If the action is misconduct by a player or substitute, or irresponsible behavior by a team official, write the infringement. Use the language of the Laws.
- 2) DISCIPLINE: If disciplinary action is needed for a player or substitute, write CAUTION or SEND OFF. If action is needed for a team official, write WARN or EXPEL. Circle the TEAM COLOR of the individual(s) being disciplined.
- 3) RESTART: Write the RESTART, if one is needed, and indicate the COLOR of the team that is to restart play. (For a dropped ball, no color need be specified.)

→ If there is no misconduct, discipline, or restart, write “NONE.”

Examples:

1. A Red attacker forcefully strikes a Blue defender just outside Blue's penalty area while the ball is in play at midfield. The referee stops play.

MISCONDUCT Violent Conduct

DISCIPLINE Send off Red Blue

RESTART DFK Red Blue

2. Two Blue substitutes begin violently fighting off the field while the ball is in play near the halfway line. The referee stops play.

MISCONDUCT Violent Conduct

DISCIPLINE Send off substitutes Red Blue

RESTART DB Red Blue

3. Just before the Blue team is about to kick-off to start the second half, the Red coach shouts a string of curses at the referee.

MISCONDUCT Irresponsible conduct

DISCIPLINE Expel (or send off) coach Red Blue

RESTART KO Red Blue

Note: Each question in this section is worth 3 points, one each for the misconduct, discipline, and restart. The color(s) of the team(s) must be supplied for full credit.

- 17) Before the Blue team takes a direct free kick, a Red player stands within two yards of the ball.
